Requirements for LAC/LAMFT Supervision Specialization License

The Arkansas Board of examiners in counseling works to ensure that quality supervision is provided to Licensed Associate Counselors and Licensed Associate Marriage & Family Therapists. Applicants for the specialization license in Clinical Supervision must meet the following requirements:

- 1. Be an LPC and/or LMFT in good standing in Arkansas for at least 3 years;
- 2. Hold a master's degree in counseling or equivalent;
- 3. Complete three years of practice in a setting for which supervision will be provided.
- 4. Successfully complete an oral examination with the Board.

Application Process for LAC/LAMFT Supervision Specialization License

Applicants for **Supervision Specialization** license must complete the following steps.

Step One: Complete and submit the following items to the board for review (it is recommended that <u>all of these</u> items be sent together, except for the official course transcript):

- 1. Submit a Specialization Application and Fee indicating LAC, LAMFT, or Dual Supervision.
- 2. Complete the Standards and Agreement 12-item form for the appropriate supervision license.
- Provide an official transcript of a 3-credit hour Masters level graduate course in Clinical Supervision which includes the minimum of 18 clock hours of supervised experience in supervision.
- 4. Submit a Philosophy of Supervision and Therapy paper for board review.
- 5. Submit a revised Statement of Intent reflecting the applicable supervision license(s).
- 6. If providing Group Supervision, submit a group supervision plan using the form provided.

Step Two: Read the Guidelines for Supervision carefully as these may be reviewed during the Oral Exam with the board.

<u>Step Three:</u> The Board will contact you via email when your Oral Exam is scheduled for the Supervision Specialization.
