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CLINICAL TREATMENT WITH INDIVIDUALS, COUPLES AND FAMILIES (6 Graduate Credit Hour Minimum in 2 Graduate Courses)

This area facilitates students developing competencies in treatment approaches specifically designed for use with a wide range of diverse individuals, couples, and families, including sex therapy, same-sex couples, working with young children, adolescents and elderly, interfaith couples, and includes a focus on evidence-based practice. 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DIVERSE, MULTICULTURAL AND/OR UNDERSERVED COMMUNITIES (3 Graduate Credit Hour Minimum)

This area facilitates students developing competencies in understanding and applying knowledge of diversity, power, privilege and oppression as these relate to race, age, gender, ethnicity, sexual orientation, gender identity, socioeconomic status, disability, health status, religious, spiritual and/or beliefs, nation of origin or other relevant social categories throughout the curriculum. It includes practice with diverse, international, multicultural, marginalized, and/or underserved communities, including developing competencies in working with sexual and gender minorities and their families as well as anti-racist practices. 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SYSTEMIC/RELATIONAL ASSESSMENT & MENTAL HEALTH DIAGNOSIS AND TREATMENT (3 Graduate Credit Hour Minimum)

This area facilitates students developing competencies in traditional psycho-diagnostic categories, psychopharmacology, the assessment, diagnosis (DSM), and treatment of major mental health issues as well as a wide variety of common presenting problems including addiction, suicide, trauma, abuse, intra-familial violence, and therapy for individuals, couples, and families managing acute chronic medical conditions, utilizing a relational/systemic philosophy. 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USE OF TECHNOLOGY IN COUNSELING/THERAPY (1 Graduate Credit Hour Minimum)

A study of the process, application and implementation of technology assisted counseling/therapy that meets state academic requirements for the distance delivery of clinical services. Areas of study will include the integration of ethical and social responsibility, current standards of practice for distance delivery and appropriateness of services with diverse individuals, relationships, and families.

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PRACTICUM AND/OR INTERNSHIPS (9 Graduate Credit Hour Minimum in 3 Graduate Courses over a minimum of 9 months)

The total number of practicum/internship hours must include a minimum of 500 clinical contact hours with individuals, couples, families and other systems physically present, at least 40% of which must be relational. The 500 hours may include a maximum of 100 alternative hours or clinical activity (e.g., couple or family groups, live cases where reflecting teams are directly involved in working with clients, etc.) that is directly related to the program's mission, outcomes, and goals. Students must receive at least 100 hours of supervision. Supervision can be individual (one supervisor with one or two supervisees) or group (one supervisor and eight or fewer students) and must include supervision utilizing observable data.

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Credential Evaluation Services

International graduate degree(s) must be submitted with an English translation and certification from a credential evaluation service and approved by the Board. These agencies must certify that the foreign degree is equivalent to a United States graduate degree. All costs for this certification are the responsibility of the applicant.
